4 Follow the road as far as a turning left onto a wide dirt road. Turn right to bypass Stoop Farm and then rejoin the track toward Booth Farm. At the farm, leave the metalled road and take the path to the left, crossing the cattle grid and following the track passes behind the only house – take the lower of the two paths, signed a bridleway. A kestrel box in a tree behind the house makes this a great place to see the birds as they hover above the gorse on the left looking for food.

The walk

1 Take the right hand path behind the Quiet Woman pub, passing the chicken huts. After several stiles, Parkhouse and Chrome hills come into view. Follow the worn field path in their direction. Beat left down the hill, crossing the road to the path opposite. Now follow painted yellow stiles.

- 5** Rounding a sharp bend in the track gives a surprise view of the upper Dove Valley spread out before you, again with great views of the two dominant features. Leave the wide track now, following the bridleway sign to the right. Go through the fanciest gate I've seen and cross the river. Bear left, climbing slightly to the gate onto the road, and turn left into Hollinsclough village.
- 6** In the square, take the path to the right past the farm turning, before going left at the last barn and following the track upward. Pass another old white farmhouse and turn left at the cross paths. Take the stile on the right before the bungalow and follow the path to the road. Cross the road and take the two stiles to the right of the house opposite, passing through the gateway across the field to drop downhill to the road. Turn left at the road junction and then take the footpath on the left heading
- 7** Walk straight ahead now to cross Beggers Bridge. At the metalled road turn left, through the yard and on to the next house, Underhill. Turn right here and head uphill for a short, steep climb. Earl Sterndale comes into view from the top. Walk downhill now back to the pub and finish.
- 8** Follow the road out of the village, passing the Cheshire Cheese pub. The last cottage on the left is amusingly called 'Endun'. Turn left here to pass more houses before bearing right, following the fingerpost for another surprise view across the valley. Drop down to the barn and turn left and then right following directions painted on the barn.
- 9** Walk straight ahead now to cross Beggers Bridge. At the metalled road turn left, through the yard and on to the next house, Underhill. Turn right here and head uphill for a short, steep climb. Earl Sterndale comes into view from the top. Walk downhill now back to the pub and finish.


